UNDERSTANDING THE SHEPHERDING

SHEPHERDING (DEVELOPING AND DEEPENING RELATIONSHIPS)

This is the function and calling responsible for maintaining and developing healthy community and enriching relationships. This involves commitment to nurture spiritual maturity, maintain communal health, defend the community against breakdown, and engender loving community among the redeemed family of God.

The shepherd- style hero includes those who defend the community, elders who shape and guide it, and humanisers who make it liveable for all.

THEOLOGICAL ROOTS IN GOD

Shepherding - God's love, his desire for relationship and intimacy

The shepherding aspects of God are seen in the community in the Trinity, and those parts of his being that relate to being a comforter, intimate, knower, divine parent, and compassionate.

JESUS THE SHEPHERD

Jesus worked to include the previously excluded people into the covenant community and in so doing created a new family, open to all who love him. Everything about him radiated concern for people and for the establishment of true human community and relationships. His healings and his miracles demonstrated God's grace, mercy, and concern. he is the perfect expression of the *Shepherd*, *the Lover of his people*.

Jesus is:

- The Good Shepherd (John 10:14-15)
- Giving himself up for us (John 10: 11,15)
- Calling us (John 10:16)
- Our owner, never abandoning us (John 10:14, 27)
- Guardian and our safety (John 10:28-29)

Jesus functioned as a shepherd:

- Showing compassion (Matthew 9:35-36).
- Feeding the hungry (Matthew 14:13-21, Matthew 15:32-39, also in Mark and Luke)
- Healing the sick (John 4:46-54, John 5:1-15, John 9:1-7, Luke 7:1-10)
- Empathising and advocating for the oppressed, hurt, abused, downtrodden, abandoned, alienated, and victimized (Luke 7). (Luke 14:12-14, Matthew 5:1-12)

THE SHEPHERDING IN THE CHURCH

The authentic SHEPHERDING church is a family of God's redeemed people that nurtures a faithful, reconciled healed community that witnesses to the Resurrection; reconciling the world to God through acceptance, support and healing. The desired social impact of the shepherding in the church is the creation of a reconciled community across race gender, age and nationality with love and acceptance at the heart; a communion with Christ.

Shepherding Functioning in the Early Church

In Acts 20:28, Paul refers to pastors, using the verb form of the word, which is translated "to feed" or "to care for". Pastors feed, tend, and protect the church. They are to do all the things that a shepherd would do for a



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flock. Similarly, in 1 Peter 5:1-2, Peter encourages these servants by saying, "Tend the flock of God." It is evident that there were others operating in the shepherding gifting in the early church: Barnabas (Acts 15:36-41)

THE SHEPHERDING AND THE INDIVIDUAL

In an individual, he or she has the unique ability to provide a comfortable space for people, a trusting relationship ripe for their personal and spiritual growth. They seek places to serve as a counsellor, discipler, care-giver or role model is concerned with the holiness of God and his relational covenant with his people.

The shepherding individual acts in an inclusive way and seeks to cultivate community wherever they find themselves, specifically a culture of family and belonging. They often are the 'social glue' at the centre of a wide network of people, often being the one person, a disparate group of people have in common. They are the people who develop the organisational EQ (emotional quotient), seeking to bring resolution and healing to disagreement (mediators). They will be the person integrating people into a socially cohesive community, fostering harmony and relational health.

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What does this mean for the individual?

- You have great faith in what you believe, explain these beliefs to others
- People tend to confide in you and come to you for advice
- You can speak the truth in love
- You are a good listener and easy to talk to, and people find it easy to share with you.

How the shepherding function might show up in the work place:

The shepherding individual is the one who builds relationships with the marginalised, the different and the nonperformers in the workplace. They create space where the hurting can feel cared for, and where the quieted can be heard. They spend more time listening and relating than they do speaking and directing. They work with people across the organisation, and will have many contacts in lots of areas. They help people gain experience and grow in their role and skills. They are also the ones who work to ensure the appropriate protection of employees and customers. Most often found in the HR, and Customer Care teams, and sometimes, as the union rep.

The **SHEPHERDING** individual relies on the **APOSTOLIC** and the **EVANGELISTIC** to help them identify new territorial opportunities and recruits for the kingdom, and on the **PROPHETIC** to help them identify ways the Body can grow and mature.

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF

- Do I mirror more of what Jesus says in John 10?
- Are the people of God caring for and showing compassion for people?
- To whom is God calling me to act as a shepherd?
- To whom am I making myself accountable?
