




THE WORD GIFTS

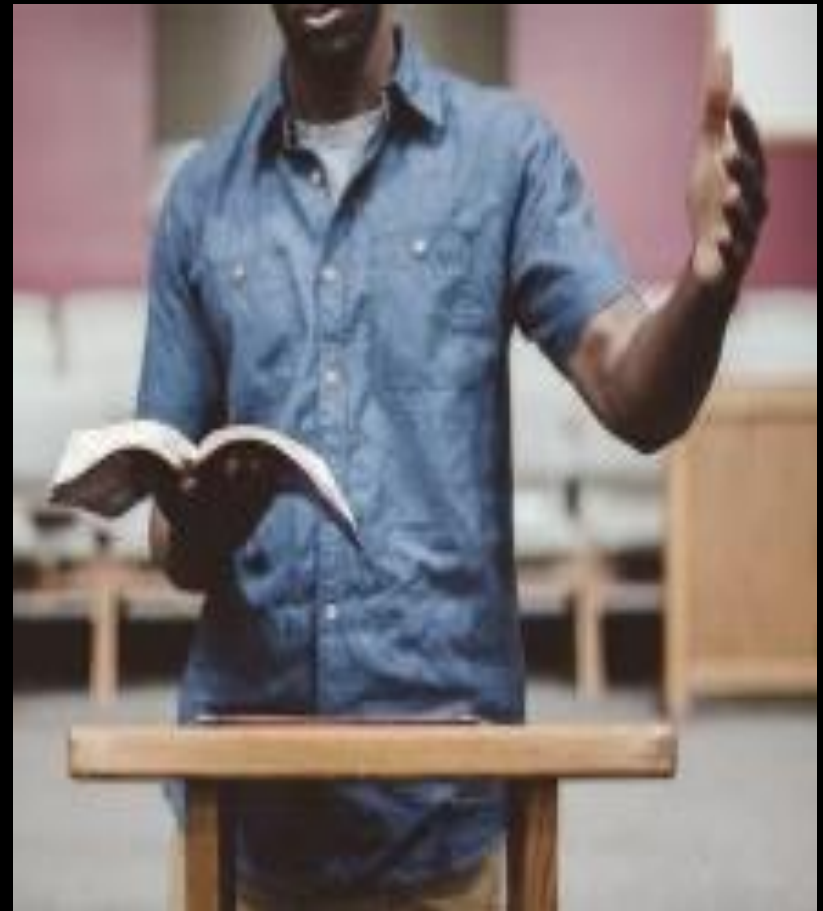

TEACHING

- Teaching makes God's truth clear and liveable
- Spirit-enabled ability to understand scripture accurately
- The Holy Spirit uses teaching to anchor believers in truth.
- Forms disciples, not spectators
- Grounds the Church in sound doctrine
- Transforms understanding into worship



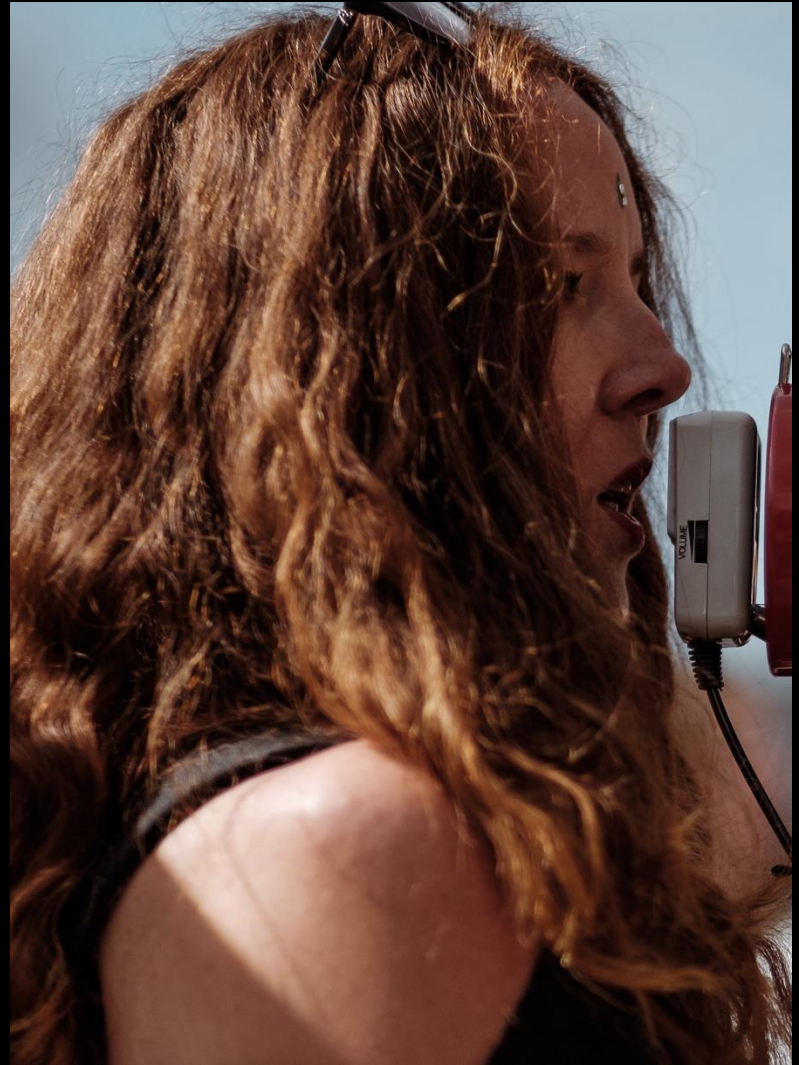
EXHORTATION



- Exhortation strengthens hearts and wills (paraklēsis).
- Exhortation helps people to keep going
- Exhortation turns truth into obedience, giving believers the strength to endure when the journey is hard — “You can make it.”
- Exhorters should lean into people, follow the Spirit’s nudges, and speak encouragement boldly.

PROPHECY

- Prophecy reveals God's heart for the moment
- It is Spirit-given insight that strengthens, encourages, and comforts (1 Cor. 14:1–3).
- It is “forth-telling,” not fortune-telling.
- It is not infallible like Scripture, nor fortune-telling, mysticism, opinion dressed as revelation, a tool for manipulation or ego.
- True prophetic ministry is humble and accountable — weighed by others (1 Cor. 14:29).



EVANGELISM



- Evangelism is the Spirit-given ability to share the gospel clearly and graciously.
- Proclaiming the Good News
- Communicating Christ clearly and lovingly
- Evangelists remind the church that God's mission is outside the building. (Romans 10)
- Gifted evangelists sense openness, ask heart-opening questions, and follow the Spirit's timing.

APOSTLESHIP

- Apostleship is a pioneering gift – starting new ministries and strengthening communities.
- Vision, structure, and mission expansion – expanding God's work into new places.
- Apostles are catalysts who operate at the leading edge where maps don't yet exist.
- Without apostles the church stagnates.
- As a church: support and celebrate apostolic leaders, back pioneering initiatives, and be ready to step into new works.



PASTORING



- Pastoring is Spirit-enabled shepherding — caring, guiding, and nurturing God's people.
- Pastors are attentive to spiritual, emotional, and relational needs, helping believers grow in Christ.
- Jesus is the model of true shepherding.
- Minister with wisdom, empathy, patience, availability, and Christlike character, encouraging growth and accountability.
- As a church: honour and support pastoral care, nurture relational community, and cultivate a culture where everyone contributes to caring for one another.

LEADERSHIP

- Leadership is Spirit-empowered stewardship – servant leadership.
- Organising, coordinating, resolving conflict, and setting direction so the church thrives.
- Build systems, support teams, create clarity, and help others flourish.
- Turn chaos into order and vision into practical steps (Moses and Nehemiah).
- Keeps the church moving forward with purpose.
- Our response: pray for wisdom, organise teams well, provide clear direction, mentor others, and lead with humility and integrity.
- As a church: support and encourage leaders, cooperate with direction, give constructive input, and serve faithfully.
